WILLIAM ROBERT PLUMLEE
 INFORMATION CONCERNING

Florida. Plumlee said that Roselli was the past associate he was referring to on July 26, 1976. (11)

On August 5, 1976, Plumlee telephoned the Phoenix Division a second time and stated that he had just received a telephone call from one Gaeton Fonzi (phonetic) from Miami, Florida. Fonzi identified himself as an investigator on Senator Schweiker's staff. Fonzi indicated that he got Plumlee's name from William Turner and Washington, D.C. sources and was inquiring about Plumlee's knowledge of John Roselli. Fonzi left the Miami phone number 305/861-1651 and a Washington, D.C. number 202/224-9024 (9025 and 9026). in case Plumlee desired to call with information.

On August 9, 1976, Plumlee telephoned the Phoenix Division and stated that as a result of the murder of Roselli, he was thinking about making all records and documents in his possession public. He said that in this regard he had been in contact the morning of August 9, 1976, with one Rick Feeney of Senator (sic) Downey's office, John English of the "Phoenix Gazette" newspaper, and Norm Lambstrum (phonetic) of the "Los Angeles Times." He stated that he had attempted to telephone Clarence M. Kelley, Director of the FBI last week with negative results. He said to verify his credibility, one of the documents in his possession was a Top Secret report of a John F. Kennedy Special Committee investigating the Cuban situation prior to the Bay of Pigs, file number OM 3-752C2. Plumlee said this was code named "PWALLA." He stated that he also had current papers regarding ongoing programs to ship guns to Guatemala. He advised that he put all of his documents in safe deposit boxes and certain people have been instructed to retrieve them should anything happen to him. Concerning Roselli's murder, he said he had no definite information on the murderers, but believed that an Organized Crime contract had been put out on Roselli from Chicago because of his involvement with CIA and that Cubans who had previously been under various contracts for CIA assisted in the murder in order to keep Roselli quiet. 1976

On August 10, 1976, Plumlee telephoned the Phoenix Division and advised that he had just talked to a private detective in Miami, Florida, who had information on an unknown Congressman in Miami.
